



The Tignes Val Claret Village reopens its doors and offers a new approach to experiencing the mountains

On 19 January, Henri Giscard d'Estaing, CEO of Club Med, in the presence of Hervé Novelli, Secretary of State for Trade, Crafts, Small and Medium Enterprises, Tourism and Services, will inaugurate the renovated Tignes Val Claret 4-Trident Village, illustrating the brand's new upscale positioning. After a renovation that totalled 12.2 million euros, this Family Village reflects a new winter sports concept. On the program: a clever combination of sports and relaxation.

Renovation

Created in 1975, the Tignes Val Claret Club Med is now imbued with an atmosphere focused on well-being. Its renovation, which was the work of François Champsaur, combines a traditional space and a contemporary décor, resulting in a new approach to experiencing winter sports. Six months of renovation and refurbishing resulted in cosier rooms with an average surface area of 30 m². There are 229 rooms spread out in two hotels: "le Grand Hôtel", made of 181 rooms including 4 Deluxe rooms, and the "Petit Claret", made of 48 rooms. Convivial areas are also part of the village's new décor. Their comfort is ideal so that families can rest and relax.

A family offering

At an altitude of 2100 metres, Tignes is a resort renowned for its ski area. The Tignes Val Claret Village benefits from the quality of the slopes and the presence of snowparks where enthusiasts can ski to their heart's content. Another asset of the Village: clients have direct ski access to Espace Killy.

After these moments of intense sports activities, clients have the opportunity to relax. At Club Med, winter sports holidays are also periods for resting. When they are back from the slopes, clients can relax at the Club Med Spa or take advantage of the heated indoor swimming pool. A weight-lifting room is also available. The Village's relaxing, friendly atmosphere continues on in its 2 bars and the La Grande Motte restaurant, where the chef proposes a wide variety of original dishes.

Childcare

So that parents can take full advantage of the slopes, childcare is available at the Tignes Villages. There is the Mini Club for children aged 4 to 11 and the Juniors' Club for teens aged 11 to 17. Several children's activities are offered as well: children aged 4 and up can participate in group Alpine skiing courses, and children aged 8 and up can learn to snowboard. Children aged 8 to 12 can also join the Champions Academy. A special teenagers ski program is offered (for teens up to 18 years).
